# Baptism is Necessary

From the beginning, baptism was essential. John was sent by God to baptize (Jn. 1:33). Jesus submitted to baptism *to fulfill all righteousness* (Mt. 3:15). Jesus’ disciples were baptizing disciples (Jn. 4:1-2). The first gospel sermon following Jesus’ ascension concluded with the command to be baptized (Acts 2:38). The message was “Be saved” and those who received the word were baptized (Acts 2:41). When Luke records the details of conversion, those who hear and believe were baptized (Acts 8:12, 38; 9:18; 10:48; 16:15, 33; 18:8; 19:5; 22:16).

Baptism unites believers with Christ—his death, burial, and resurrection (Rom. 6:3-4). Baptism is when God performs a spiritual circumcision which removes our sin, unites us with Christ’s burial, and makes us alive together with him having forgiven us all our transgressions (Col. 2:11-13). Baptism is the new birth which Jesus said is necessary (Jn. 3:3, 5). When you are baptized, you are clothed with Christ (Gal. 3:27). Baptism now saves you through the resurrection of Jesus Christ (1 Pet. 3:21).

If the evidence for the necessity of baptism is so plentiful, why do many “Christians” say that baptism is not necessary? There are many reasons people might deny the necessity of baptism. Rather than addressing each one, I simply offer the following example as a warning.

Israel knew that God condemned idolatry. The Ten Commandments began with “You shall have no other gods” and “You shall not make a graven image.” However, Israel worshiped the golden calf at the foot of the holy mountain, worshiped Baal at Peor, and followed the Canaanites into idolatrous practices (Ex. 32; Num. 25; Jud. 2). Ultimately, God exiled them for their disobedience (2 Kin. 17). Israel knew what God commanded and refused to obey. Likewise, baptism is God’s command and many refuse to obey.
