Thoughts About Elders

How long should an elder serve? Should he shepherd a congregation for a few years or until his death? Scripture doesn’t say. If his health prevents him from carrying out his shepherding duties, common sense may lead him to resign. Some congregations re-confirm their elders every 2-3 years. This provides an opportunity for re-evaluation for shepherds and sheep alike. A man’s life circumstances may change over the years. I hope our shepherds serve willingly and not under compulsion.

Should an elder’s family be held to a higher standard than other members of Christ’s body? Sometimes, an elder’s wife and children are expected to be “superior” examples of Christian living. Nowhere in Scripture are the families of elders required to be better Christians than everyone else. Sometimes a wife of an elder will feel obligated to exercise shepherding authority. In Scripture, the wife of an elder does not have a special role nor higher spirituality than any other godly woman. Requiring more of elders’ wives and having a wife who functions as a shepherd are equally unscriptural (Mt. 15:3; 2Jn. 1:9).

Scripture requires a shepherd to be able to teach and correct, but it does not require that he be a powerful public speaker and debater (1Tim. 3:2; Tit. 1:9). God only requires the ability to teach and to correct. Since other qualities center around being an excellent father and husband, it seems appropriate that he would be able to teach and correct as a father or a husband might be called upon to do. In other words, he may not be the best pulpit preacher or the most interesting Bible class teacher and still be a man who is apt to teach and correct. He may be skilled in small group interactions, rather than larger groups.

Being a leader in the church is stressful on a man and his family. We can help them by appreciating and loving them (1Th. 5:12-13). We can treat them the way we would want to be treated (Mt. 7:12). We can speak to them and about them with kindness and respect (Eph. 4:29). Don’t give gossip an ear. Go to them like a brother or father and make peace. Let’s do our part to make their work joyful (1Th. 2:19).
