"Lake Chargoggagoggmanchauggagoggchaubunagungamaugg"

Guess what lake has the longest known name! It's found in Massachusetts and is an Indian name. Pronouncing it correctly is a considerable feat, especially if you can do it without taking a breath. Perhaps the most interesting fact about "Lake Chargog" is what the name means. It means, "You fish on your side. I fish on my side. Nobody fishes in the middle" (cf. Pictorial Atlas of the USA and Canada, p. 71).

Consider the wisdom of an Indian proverb turned tongue-twisting, tourist-attracting ID of a New England body of water. "Nobody fishes in the middle." In other words, "You had better stay out of the middle because we don't know what you're up to when you're there." Whatever compelled them to come up with the impressive name, they were right. The middle is no place to be. Joshua preferred to keep himself and his family out of there (Jos 24:15). Elijah encouraged all who saw the great events at Mt. Carmel to get out of the middle (1Ki 18:21). Elijah wasn't in the middle, but the people rather liked it there. They found out later that sometimes you can't stand in the middle (1Ki 18:38-39).

When it comes to discipleship, nobody can "fish in the middle." Jesus says, "He that is not with me is against me..." (Mt 12:30). He is the fisher of men, and so must all his disciples be (Mt 4:19). A fellow could get drowned out there in the middle, overcome by evil, buried without eternal preparation (Eccl 8:10-11), and baptized in a lake of condemnation (Rev 20:10ff). At the very least, a Christian trying to stay in the middle will invoke the suspicions and questions of Christian brothers and sisters—whether it be engaging in the morally or the doctrinally questionable! Pick sides—God's or Satan's. But remember, "Nobody fishes in the middle!"
