He Came

It was inconvenient. It was risky. It was painful, but He came:

“...although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross” (Phil. 2:5-8).

When I compare His willingness to redeem a rebellious world with my own disposition to render aid to people who are in trouble because they ignored wisdom and common sense, I am humbled by His readiness. If someone has car trouble and I am already out there on the road with them, I may help if I’m not in a hurry. But if I am at home relaxing and the need is a few hours away, I am unlikely to make the effort unless he is a very close friend or relative. The greater the inconvenience, expense, and effort the less likely I am to leave my home. If I do leave, I’m probably not going to be cheerful about it.

Consider the trouble, cost, and difficulty which Jesus Christ faced to help this lost world. It may help you to appreciate His sacrifice a bit more, or it may motivate you to be a bit more generous in rendering help to others...
“We know love by this, that He laid down His life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. But whoever has the world’s goods, and sees his brother in need and closes his heart against him, how does the love of God abide in him?” (1 Jn. 3:16-17).
