“Be at Peace with One Another”

What makes a congregation healthy? Right doctrine? Love toward God? Individual faithfulness? Biblical worship and organization? While these are important, let’s not forget our obligations to one another. We are the members of Christ’s body and mutually responsible for one another’s spiritual health... *“For just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another”* (Rom. 12:4-5).

There are more than twenty-five “one another” commandments in the New Testament. A few of them are repeated several times—love, serve, and greet. When we fulfill our mutual responsibilities to one another the body of Christ is healthy, self-healing, united, pure, protected, attractive, glorifying God, and meets every member’s needs.

The first “one another” assignment appears in the gospel of Mark: *“Be at peace with one another”* (9:50). Jesus speaks of dying and rising from the dead. The apostles debate among themselves which one of them is the greatest, and they try to stop a person from performing a miracle in the name of Jesus. Jesus directs them toward actions which lead to peace—humble service, cooperation, helping one another get to heaven, and using extreme measures to remove sin from one’s own life.

Striving to be the greatest and creating cliques does not lead to cohesive teamwork, mutual support, and a healthy body of Christ. Let’s strive to be at peace with one another.
